Memorable Melody: ‘Mr. Blue Sky’

A scientific study named it the happiest song in the world, thanks to its bouncy beat, familiar key, and sunny lyrics celebrating a clear, cloudless day. Recorded in 1977 by Electric Light Orchestra, “Mr. Blue Sky” was written by the band’s frontman Jeff Lynne during a working vacation in the Swiss Alps, where weeks of clouds and rain blotted out his creativity. As soon as the sun emerged, Lynne captured the simple joy he felt in the song’s chorus: “Mr. Blue Sky, please tell us why you had to hide away for so long?” Though it wasn’t a hit single, the track is now considered ELO’s signature tune.

A Bunch of Blarney

One of Ireland’s best-known legends, the Blarney Stone is said to give the “gift of gab”—the ability to charm others with witty words—to all who kiss it. Visitors of Blarney Castle, located in County Cork, must climb 127 steps up a steep spiral staircase, lie down on the floor, and lean backward to land a smooch on the stone, which is embedded in an outer wall 100 feet above the ground.

Court Street residents will receive \$500 per referral and McFarlan Home residents will receive \$50 per referral.

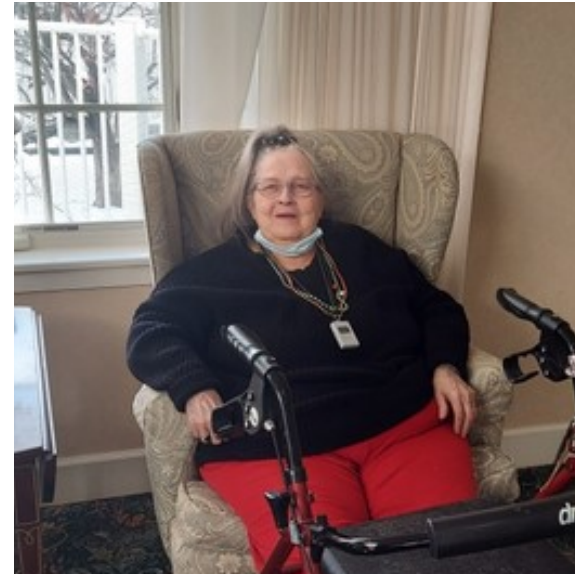
Resident Spotlight

Yellowstone: A National Treasure

This month marks a major conservation milestone: 150 years since the creation of Yellowstone National Park, the first-ever national park. Located mostly in Wyoming and parts of Montana and Idaho, it was established March 1, 1872.

One of the most unique places on Earth, Yellowstone sits atop a giant volcano. Roughly half of the world's hydrothermal features are found within the park, in the form of geysers, colorful hot springs and bubbling mudpots. The famous geyser Old Faithful erupts around 20 times a day, shooting hot water and steam more than 100 feet in the air.

With mountains, forests, grasslands, lakes, rivers and waterfalls, Yellowstone's diverse landscape is home to abundant wildlife, including the greatest concentration of mammals in the continental U.S. Millions of visitors flock to the park every year to view elk, bears, wolves and huge herds of bison, which have lived in the area since prehistoric times.

Humans are also part of Yellowstone's rich history. Evidence shows that people have been living on the land for at least 11,000 years. Today, more than 20 Native American tribes have strong connections to the region.



Neighborly Lessons From Mr. Rogers

He taught many children the importance of kindness, and his legacy lives on every year on his birthday, March 20, as Won't You Be My Neighbor Day. Take some pointers from Mr. Rogers on how to do good in your neighborhood.

Say hello. In each episode of "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood," the soft-spoken host took time to say "Hi, neighbor!" to his viewers. A simple greeting can make others feel noticed and important. Regularly exchanging hellos can also lead to a friendly relationship between neighbors.

Communicate and listen. Kids learned how to handle conflict peacefully from the puppets that lived in the Neighborhood of Make-Believe. Hearing what others have to say and offering your own opinion in a gentle manner makes solving problems easier.

Be a helper. During frightening events, Mr. Rogers reminded us of his mother's advice: "Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." No matter what's going on in the world, you can always offer assistance to members of your community.
